# Does Lithuania need base stations for communications

Who regulates broadband in Lithuania?

The Communications Regulatory Authority(Rysiu reguliavimo tarnyba) is the independent national regulatory institution that monitors and regulates Lithuania's digital connectivity markets. The Lithuanian plan for ultra-fast broadband development was launched by the Ministry of Transport and Communications in October 2021.
